

Summer at NHR = Reading and FUN!




With over 200 students at three locations, the NHR summer session built on the progress made by our students in the school year. Summer at NHR is full of energy and smiles!

Students attended their regular one-on-one tutoring program and have the opportunity to participate in enrichment clubs to follow a passion or explore something new. The traditionally popular clubs were back, including math (yes, really!), chess, and arts and crafts. Students could also choose from a broad range of other clubs including Dinosaur Club, STEM

Experiments, and Marine Biology. Everyone took books home to build their own libraries. We offered free field trips for families on the weekends including kayaking, a Thimble Island cruise, and a visit to the Norwalk Aquarium thanks to a grant from the Woman's Seamen's Friend Society of CT.


Sixteen of our youngest students attended our daily Kindergarten Camp for the month of July. They had a great time building their foundational literacy skills and enjoyed an author visit from Deborah Freedman and programs from the Peabody Museum and Mystic Aquarium.

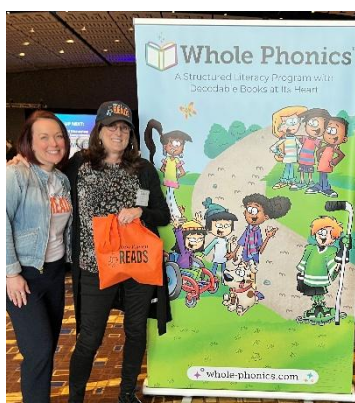

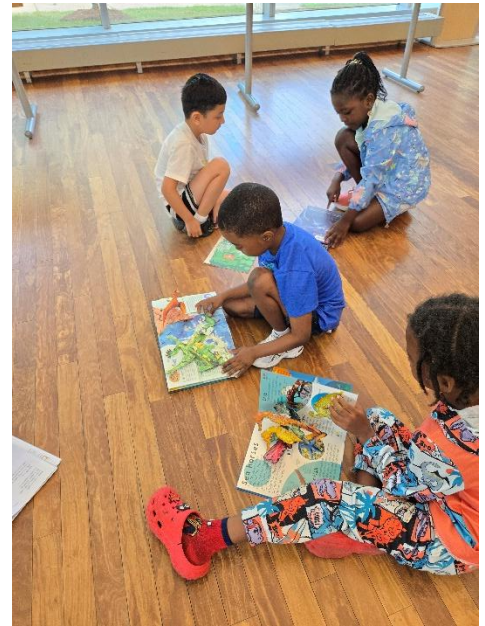
NHR Summer Numbers
