

Building Home and Classroom Libraries - Thanks to Book Bridge!




Last year, we created Book Bridge – a reverse field trip program to bring books and activities to local classrooms. Teachers told us how disappointed their students were because they were unable to visit NHR on a field trip due to reduced funds for buses. In 2023-24, we served 23 classrooms in both November and April. The program was a huge success!

We are so pleased to report that Book Bridge is back this fall and it has grown to 35 classrooms in New Haven, West Haven and Hamden! Teachers receive 3 gently used books for each student plus brand new books to read to their classes and keep in their classroom libraries. Our Book Bridge deliveries will continue over the next few weeks and we will return to each classroom again in the spring.

This program has been a great resource for local teachers and is helping to build home libraries for students across the area. One Kindergarten teacher told us, “I think this program is wonderful! My students were all so excited to be able to pick out the books they were interested in!”



NHR is expanding our reach with programs in two new schools!



As the Lead Literacy Organization for the New Haven Tutoring Initiative (NHTI), New Haven Reads has the privilege of working with 15 community partners and schools to empower our community's children with critical reading skills – the skills they will need as they progress through school and into their future careers.

We currently have 368 NHTI students who are participating, either through our partner organizations or schools. **We added two new schools this fall – the Barack H. Obama Magnet University School and Lincoln-Bassett Community School – creating opportunities for access for new students.**

Last year, NHTI students showed significant increases on all areas of word recognition and decoding between fall and spring testing, with 97% of students improving in at least one area of literacy. New Haven Reads is proud to be a part of this tremendous collaborative effort. Together we are building a community of students who are empowered to be successful.

New Haven Reads was pleased to welcome State Representative Toni Walker to our Bristol Street location earlier this fall.


