Thanks to your support, **we had an incredible year of expansion**, growing our programs with new locations in local schools and the New Haven Housing Authority.

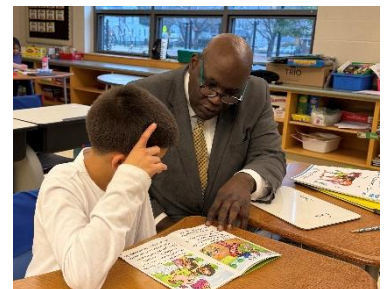
We are so proud of our students - **100% improved their literacy scores** and on average, students improved by one grade level in seven months.

**Our Book Bank was busy** hosting field trips for 1,399 local students from 85 classrooms. For those classes that couldn't come to NHR, we delivered the books to them serving an additional 1,220 students from 53 unique classrooms.

**Perhaps you saw us out and about in the community?** Our Outreach team attended over 50 events in our community spreading the word, recruiting volunteers, and distributing books.

Thank you to everyone who contributed so generously to our annual appeal. We had a hugely successful campaign which will allow us to serve even more children in 2026.

Working one-on-one has been enjoyable for Elaine. She communicates well with the site team both in person and through the session notes to keep her student's program on track.

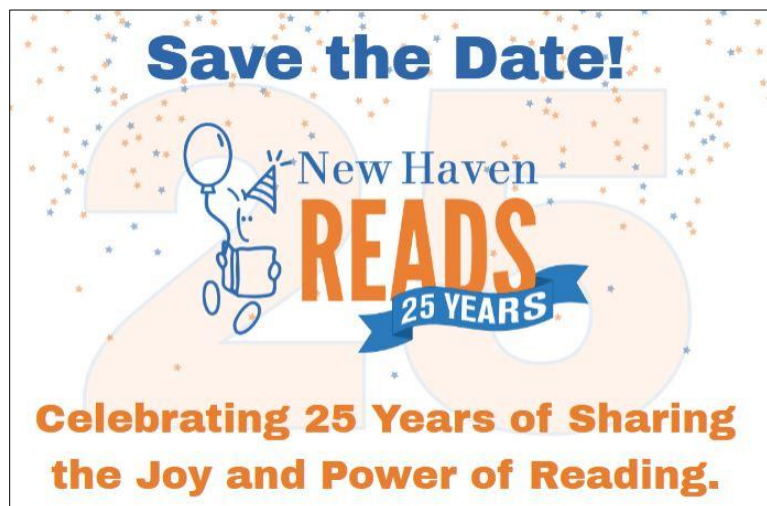

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## **The Power of One: Spotlighting a Dedicated Monthly Donor**



The passing of New Haven Reads' founder Chris Alexander in 2011 helped New Haven Reads' monthly sustaining donor Doug Hausladen realize how truly possible it is to have an impact on one's community.

**Doug acknowledges, "Literacy is such a foundational issue, and the need isn't going away any time soon."**

Learning about alarming rates of local illiteracy while working for the New Haven transportation system, Doug saw firsthand the significant literacy challenges faced by our community with many adults who can't read parking signs or engage with written words in society or work. He told us, **"What has kept me as a sustaining donor for over a decade is that this work truly matters, is deeply local, and deeply needed."**

Supporting New Haven Reads as a sustaining monthly donor provides Doug with the necessary stability in his personal budget while making an impact. Huge thanks to Doug and all of our other sustaining donors who help us maintain our programs across the year!

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## Chapter Book Challenge - motivating students to read more



A firm NHR favorite, the Chapter Book Challenge encourages students to read more text to expand their reading fluency and stamina. Students develop more focus and concentration while building their reading confidence, vocabulary, and background knowledge.

Students receive tickets for reading based on the pages they read, both at NHR and at home. They can allocate those tickets to a drawing for a selection of engaging prizes, including board games, books, and art supplies. The more the students read, the more tickets they receive so they have more chances to win the prize they would like. We adapt the

challenge to accommodate all reading levels.

Tutors support their students and encourage students to discuss their books and write about them, extending the learning experience. Our Willow Street students recently completed *the most recent Challenge and were excited to get the results!*
